Students know she believes in them, and as a result they tap into and express the deepest parts of themselves.

However, helping students learn life lessons through art is Mary Jo's greatest contribution at CHAS. Emily Perry, a former student, says, "Through her I have learned that I should not be satisfied with one solution to anything and that there are always better paths to take. Now as I continue through life I can truly see the importance of this lesson and how it will make me become a successful and all around better person."
